Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

The school receives its primary funding from the Department of Education (DE). This funding is provided as an amount per child each year and is designed to cover essential requirements associated with teaching the basic curriculum.

Why are families still asked to pay a contribution?

We have over 250 children at Yarra PS, each with different needs and different strengths. The parent contributions we receive enable us to provide a truly comprehensive and enriching program for our students – with a diverse range of educational activities and opportunities – over and above those associated with the basic curriculum.

For example, our Kitchen Garden Program is not part of the DE basic curriculum and is wholly funded by Yarra PS, this includes all kitchen and garden supplies as well as garden maintenance to keep the garden growing the food that the students cook and eat. And that's why your parent contributions are so very crucial.

#### **Payment methods**

- a. Option #1 = Payment in full in February 2025 through Compass, EFT at school or direct deposit.
- b. Option #2 = Payment in half yearly instalments –#1 in Term 1 February and #2 First week of Term 3 July 2025 by EFT at school or direct deposit
- c. Option #3 = Payment in quarterly instalments first week of each Term by EFT at school or by direct deposit
- d. Option #4 = Payment in monthly instalments 10 months from February to November through a Compass payment plan (Set and forget).



#### **Refunds**

Yarra Primary School refund arrangements.

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

Contributions for 2025 are not required until 2025. Yarra Primary School will post the 2025 Curriculum Contributions on Compass in late January 2025.
